NV Energy Provides CFLs to School Employees in Rural Nevada

NV Energy is distributing more than 41,000 free compact fluorescent lamps (CFLs) to teachers, administrators and staff in 10 rural school districts in northern Nevada.

“We’ve worked closely with local school districts over the past few years through our Sure Bet for Schools program to assist them with projects to make their facilities more energy efficient,” said John

Hargrove, Energy Efficiency and Conservation Program manager for NV Energy. “Now, school district employees can also be more energy efficient at home, and they’ll help reduce the demand for energy in northern Nevada.”

NV Energy representatives have started traveling to the schools to provide each school district employee with a 12-pack of ENERGY STAR qualified CFLs. These energy efficient alternatives consume 75 percent less energy than incandescent bulbs, last 7 to 10 times longer and emit less heat. “A single 12-pack of CFLs can save up to \$540 on energy costs for a homeowner over the life of the bulbs, assuming an average electricity cost of 12 cents per kilowatt hour,” Hargrove said.

NV Energy distributed more than 2 million CFLs in Nevada in 2007 and the company expects to distribute approximately 4 million by the end of 2008. While some have been given away to utility customers most have been sold at substantially discounted prices at several retail outlets, including Home Depot, Lowe’s, Ace Hardware, Wal-Mart, Costco, Big Lots and Amazon.com.

The new WindGenerations Program provides rebates to NV Energy customers who install approved small wind turbines. Residential customers, small businesses, agricultural customers, schools and public buildings are eligible to participate. In addition, a separate HydroGenerations program has been created to provide rebates to agricultural customers who install small hydroelectric projects.

The rebates will help reduce your cost of installing a wind turbine and lower your energy bills. Wind projects can also help protect the environment and increase our energy independence by taking advantage of abundant natural energy sources right in our own backyards.

For the 2008-2009 Program Year, the rebates range from \$1.50 to \$3 per watt. For example, residential customers could receive up to \$25,000 for a 10 kilowatt wind system.
