Get Credit for Energy Efficiency

Tax credits are available at 30 percent of the cost, with no upper limit through 2016 (for existing homes and new construction) for geothermal heat pumps, solar panels, solar water heaters, small wind energy systems and fuel cells.

College Scholarships Available

If you know of a Nevada high school student in search of a scholarship opportunity, NV Energy's Powerful Partnership Scholarship program may be just the ticket. The program recognizes the accomplishments of outstanding high school students who have demonstrated leadership in academics and community service.



Students must have a minimum grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale and completed 20 hours of community service within the previous 12 months. The one-time scholarships of \$1,000 awards are made based on the program's selection criteria and on the number of applications received.

To be considered for a Powerful Partnership Scholarship, high school seniors must submit a completed application by February 29.
