Do-It-Yourself Savings

Simple steps you can take around your home can save you from 10 to 25 percent on your energy bill. Here are a few ideas:

- Plan on planting trees and shrubs on the south and west side(s) of your residence. The vegetation acts as insulation, provides shading and reduces warm air in your home.
- Consider buying a cover for your pool to retain heat in the water.
- If your AC unit is on the ground, keep the area around it clean and free of obstructions to maintain air flow.
- Whenever it is practical, barbecue outdoors and be aware of the heat and effects of the sun on your body. Reducing the heat coming into your home from any source, such as cooking, will reduce the load on your air conditioning.

Energy savings depend upon many factors. The costs contained in this article are based on estimates for a typical 1,800 sq. ft. home. Your actual savings in the cost of energy may be less than the estimates provided here if your house is a different size or if your energy usage is different from those assumed.

Before you start digging... even small projects like planting trees and shrubs call 811 or 800.227.2600. You'll get the approximate location of multiple underground utility lines marked for free. Even if you're a contractor, call at least two days before you dig. Digging without calling can disrupt service to an entire neighborhood and potentially result in fines and repair costs.


