

DEFERRED ENERGY CONSUMER SESSION AND HEARING NOTICE

The Public Utilities Commission of Nevada (PUCN) has scheduled a Consumer Session and Evidentiary Hearings for Sierra Pacific Power Company d/b/a NV Energy to review the prudence of the natural gas expenses for the 12-month period ending December 31, 2014, and to reset the Renewable Energy Program Rate (REPR). This filing was designated as Commission Docket 15-02041. If approved by the PUCN, customers would see a 0.12 percent decrease in rates or an annual revenue decrease of \$163,632 overall customer classes.

PROPOSED RATE CHANGE

On February 27, 2015 NV Energy made its annual mandatory Deferred Energy Accounting Adjustment (DEAA) filing with

the Public Utilities Commission of Nevada (PUCN). The filing requests approval of the natural gas expenses for the 12-month period ended December 31, 2014, and to reset the Renewable Energy Program Rate (REPR) to be changed from \$0.00086 to \$(0.00039) per therm.

The overall effect of granting the relief requested is to decrease customer rates by \$163,632 or 0.12 percent over all classes of customers.

The chart below contains a list of customer classes and their associated proposed percentage and dollar amount changes. These rate changes are approximate and represent averages for each customer class. Actual changes to individual customers' bills will vary. Ultimately the PUCN may set rates that are higher or lower than those requested by the company.

The chart below reflects the adjustment for the average monthly bill for each customer class. Actual changes to individual customers' bills will vary depending on the level of consumption.
