PRELIMINARY STATEMENT

A. Territory Serviced by the Utility

Nevada Power Company supplies electric service to a part of Nye County, including but not limited to the Nevada Test Site, Lathrop Wells, and Amargosa Valley and to the communities of Las Vegas, North Las Vegas, East Las Vegas, Goodsprings Indian Springs, Laughlin, Searchlight, Cal Nev Ari, Nelson, Cottonwood Cove, the City of Henderson, and portions of Clark County adjacent to the above cities and towns.

B. Purpose

These Rules, approved by the Public Service Commission of Nevada, are designed to inform customers, builders, architects and electrical contractors, and to govern the supplying and taking of electric service so that each Customer may have the greatest practicable use and enjoyment of service consistent with good service to himself and other customers, and with safety to the community and to the Utility.

C. Supersedes Previous Rules

These Rules supersede and annul all regulations by whatever term designated which may heretofore have governed the supplying and taking of the utility's electric service.

D. Agreements with Customers.

1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, a utility may not enter into any agreement with a customer under terms which are inconsistent with the provisions of NAC 704.302 to 704.390, inclusive.
2. Nothing in NAC 704.302 to 704.390, inclusive shall be deemed to preclude a utility from entering into an agreement with a customer under terms which are more favorable to the customer than those provided by those sections of the NAC.

E. Revision

These Rules, as well as all Rate Schedules, may not be revised, waived, or annulled by the utility except after approval of such action by the Public Service Commission of Nevada.

- F. The Commission will modify or waive the application of any provision of NAC 704.306 to a particular utility if it finds that the application of that provision would unreasonably burden the utility.
- G. The utility has revised its tariff to comply with the provisions contained in the Consumer Bill of Rights which was promulgated by Order of the Public Service Commission of Nevada and became effective on January 5, 1989. To the extent the provisions of this tariff are determined by final order of the Public Service Commission to be inconsistent with the provisions of the Consumer Bill of Rights, the provisions of the Consumer Bill of Rights will apply. Any inconsistency will be resolved in accordance with applicable statutes.

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
