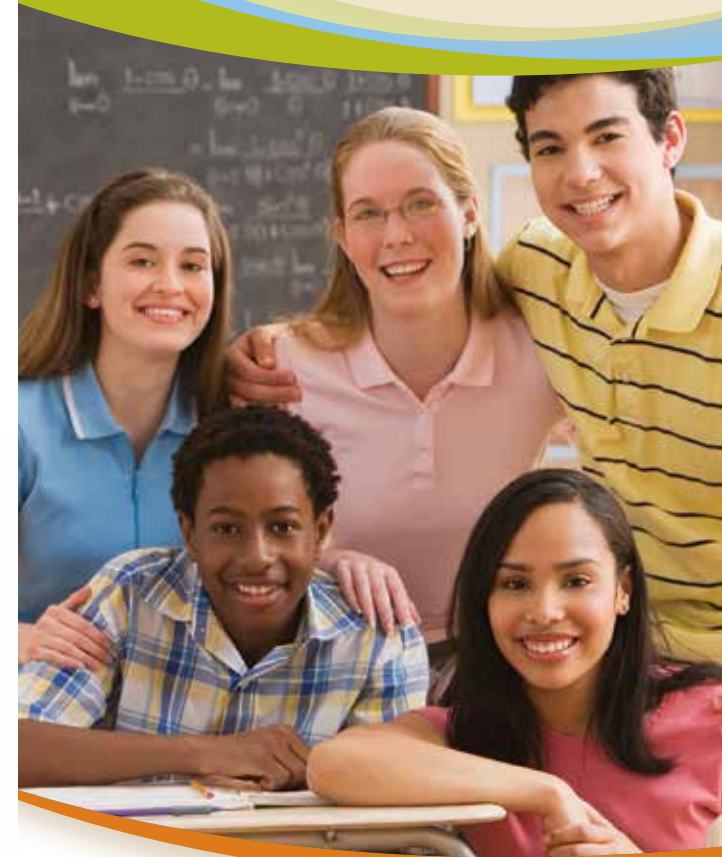

# Powerful Partnership Scholarship Program For High School Seniors



## Scholarship Goals

At NV Energy we are committed to building strong, healthy and diverse communities and we believe that a strong community has an educated and productive workforce at its base. To support attainment of a higher education for our youth, NV Energy is offering our Powerful Partnership Scholarship Program.

The Powerful Partnership program recognizes and encourages the accomplishments of outstanding high school seniors who have demonstrated leadership in academics and community service. Our goal is to support tomorrow's leaders' educational achievements while creating a legacy of community involvement.

Each year, NV Energy offers Powerful Partnership scholarships for high school seniors throughout Nevada. One-time scholarships of \$1,000 are awarded based on the program's selection criteria and on the number of applications received.

## Application Process

Seniors in public or private high schools or those who are home schooled are encouraged to apply for Powerful Partnership scholarships. In southern Nevada, Clark County School District (CCSD) scholarship applications are available from your local high school scholarship counselor or [www.nvenergy.com/scholarships](http://www.nvenergy.com/scholarships). In northern Nevada, the Community Foundation of Western Nevada administers the Powerful Partnership scholarships. Applications are available at [www.nevadafund.org](http://www.nevadafund.org).



## Eligibility Criteria

- U.S. citizen or legal permanent resident
- High school senior, attending school or home schooled, in NV Energy's Nevada service territory
- Completed 20 hours of community service within the previous 12 months as validated by school counselor, agency or organization. (Volunteer service may include your work with a nonprofit agency such as a church group, Boy or Girl Scouts, Key Club, etc.)
- Demonstrated academic success with a minimum grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. (Please include your advanced placement classes, student clubs and associations such as Debate Club and Student Government, etc.)
- Personal goal of pursuing a degree at an accredited post-secondary institution

## In-eligible Applicants

- Relatives of NV Energy employees and retirees (includes children, grandchildren, step-children, etc.)

## Application Requirements

To be considered for a Powerful Partnership Scholarship, high school seniors must submit the following on or before March 1:

- In southern Nevada, complete the Clark County School District Scholarship Application provided at [www.nvenergy.com/scholarships](http://www.nvenergy.com/scholarships)
- In northern Nevada, complete the application provided by the Community Foundation of Western Nevada at [www.nevadafund.org](http://www.nevadafund.org)
- Official high school transcript (including first semester senior grades)
- A personal statement outlining career goals and aspirations (you may include a list of your family responsibilities such as child or elder care, etc.)
- An essay explaining why community service is important.

(Please keep your word count between 100 and 300 words and include your most memorable volunteer experience.)

- Resumé of community service projects, number of volunteer hours, work experience, school activities, awards and recognition, school/community leadership and academic achievement.
- A letter of recommendation from a school official
- One to three letters of recommendation from an agency or organization where the student volunteered

*The decision of the scholarship committee is final in all matters related to the above practices.*

## Evaluation and Notification Process

- Applications must be submitted on or before March 1
- Scholarship applicants are evaluated on the following criteria: demonstrated leadership, commitment to community and academic achievement
- Award notifications are mailed prior to April 30
- Scholarships are sent directly to the trade school, college or university and all unused funds are returned to the NV Energy Foundation
