Enclosed for filing with the Commission please find the First Amendment to the 2013-2032 integrated resource plan and the Energy Supply Plan Update for 2015 filed by Nevada Power Company d/b/a NV Energy. This filing includes Nevada Power's initial emissions reduction and capacity replacement plan, filed pursuant to NRS § 704.7311 and LCB R131-13.

The Application contains fifteen non-confidential volumes. A detailed listing is provided in the Table of Contents.

Consistent with the Commission's electronic filing regulations as adopted in Docket No. 07-03015, following this cover letter please find a table of contents for the complete filing. A table of contents for each volume appears on the cover page which provides the page reference for each item in the volume.

Confidentiality. Accompanying this transmittal letter are portions of the filing that are to be kept under seal pursuant to NRS § 703.190(2) and NAC § 703.527. Unredacted versions of confidential information are printed on pink paper, appropriately marked and contained in six sealed envelopes. A description of this confidential material is set forth below:

Confidential Envelope #1. The fuel and purchased power price forecasts used to prepare the ERCR Plan are commercially confidential and cannot be provided to the public without harming the ability of Nevada Power to effectively trade in the energy marketplace on behalf of its customers. This information is found in Technical Appendix FPP-1, FPP-2, Gas-3 and MF-1.

Confidential Envelope # 2. Portions of the Load Forecast, Supply Plan and ESP Narratives are confidential. These portions of the narratives show commercially confidential information regarding dispatch costs. Portions of TRAN-1, GEN-1, GEN-2, GEN-4, REN-3, ECON-3, ECON-4 and ECON-6 show performance characteristics of Nevada Power's individual generating units. The publication of this information could disadvantage Nevada Power's customers as the Company participates in the market on their behalf. TRAN-2, a self-

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assessment audit report prepared for the North American Electric Reliability Corporation (“NERC”), describes and analyzes information that qualifies for Critical Infrastructure Protection.

Confidential Envelope #3. Nevada Power is including in this filing redacted and confidential versions of the Asset Purchase Agreement and Exhibits executed with the owners of Las Vegas Cogeneration Units 1 and 2 and with the owners of the Sun-Peak generating units. While the agreements contain provisions relating to confidentiality that were important provisions to our counterparties, Nevada Power was able to obtain a partial waiver of the confidentiality provisions of the agreements in order to designate the bulk of the agreement as non-confidential. The counterparties’ concerns are that disclosure of the un-redacted commercial terms could place the counterparties at a commercial disadvantage if the Commission was to deny the acquisition of these facilities by Nevada Power and the facilities were again marketed.

Confidential Volumes #4 and #5. All contracts executed with all parties to the Moapa Solar Project set forth in Technical Appendices MOA-1 through MOA-5 are confidential according to the terms of the agreements.

Confidential Envelope #6. The agreements executed between Nevada Power and SunPower Corporate Systems related to the Nellis Solar Array II project are confidential according to the terms of the agreements. These agreements are located at Technical Appendices NEL-5, NEL-6 and NEL-7. In addition, NEL-9 is a usage analysis of load served by and to the Nellis Air Force Base and contains confidential customer-specific information.
