



Sierra Pacific Scholarship Program at the University of Nevada, Reno

ierra Pacific sponsors scholarships at the University of Nevada, Reno, to enable students to pursue studies in fields that relate to activities performed in the electric, gas and water utility industry.

A total of 87 scholarships of \$2,000 each are offered over a five-year period, beginning in the fall of 1997, to students in the College of Engineering, College of Business Administration and Center for Environmental Sciences and Engineering.

Five scholarships per year will be designated for Native American graduates of northern Nevada high schools in Sierra Pacific's territory. Scholarships not awarded will be made available to economically disadvantaged students.

These scholarships are part of a larger contribution plan designed to provide meaningful, long term benefits to the university, to its students and their families, and to the entire northern Nevada community. The Sierra Pacific Scholarship and Research Program continues the long partnership that Sierra Pacific and the university have enjoyed, including the funding of lecture series, support of academic programs and the implementation of cost-saving energy systems.

To be considered for the Sierra Pacific Scholarships, undergraduate students:

- 1) Must have graduated from an accredited northern Nevada high school, northern Nevada community college or northeastern California high school within Sierra Pacific's service territory;
- 2) Shall take a minimum of 12 regularly scheduled credit hours per semester at the university for the academic year in which they receive the scholarship.
- **3)** Must major in a field of study offered within the Center for Environmental Sciences and Engineering, the College of Business Administration or the College of Engineering.

Center for Environmental Sciences and Engineering

The University Center for Environmental Sciences and Engineering (CESE) administers interdisciplinary environmental sciences and engineering programs at the graduate level. The Sierra Pacific Scholarships will assist undergraduate students pursuing degree programs in the environmental sciences to better prepare them for graduate school or the work force.
